IMPORTANT INFORMATION Finish Characteristics

Please keep the following in mind when choosing your finish:

Samples available in our showroom represent the appearance you may look forward to in a cabinetry order of the same wood specie, door style, finish and elements, but it cannot be guaranteed to match every unique piece in your cabinetry. There may be a visible difference between the samples and newly produced pieces in the same finish and species. Although great care will be taken, reasonable variation must be expected for a hand-crafted product. A combination of wood species, finishes, door style profiles, and physical elements will capture varying amounts of highlight or glazing, affecting the appearance of the final project. Expect variation in the finished product, especially between doors, box work and moldings.

Because no two trees look alike, authentic woods vary in color and character markings such as streaks, knots and grain patterns. Only select hardwoods and hardwood veneers have been used to construct your cabinetry. Since the stains may attract differently to these grain patterns, some natural light and dark areas may result. Mineral streaks may add to the distinctive appearance, reflecting the tree's "life history" as it absorbed minerals differently from one area to another. The beauty lies in these natural variations of color and grain that give each cabinet its own individual charm. Grain and apparent texture may range from even and consistent to varied and dramatic.

The beauty of these products is protected with a furniture-quality conversion varnish finish. After a period of time, there may be changes in the finish color as it ages in its surrounding conditions. Due to this natural aging process, the finish can also "deepen" over time, darkening the color of the wood or creating a "shadowing" effect where doors overlap the frame. These are inherent characteristics of the finish, and the natural aging process adds to the unique appearance of the cabinetry. Due to these minor differences in tone, it may not be possible to match the finish color of existing cabinets exactly when replacing doors or adding cabinets at a later date.

These natural variations result in unique character markings on adjacent cabinets, on pairs of doors and even within the same panel. These variations can also appear on edges of hardwood doors where solid lumber cores are exposed in certain styles.

We point out this unique character of natural finishes to remind you that each piece of wood is different and the varied effect of naturally finished cabinetry in a complete kitchen or bath may be different from that represented by a smaller display or finish sample. The variations are broad, and that is where the beauty of natural wood lies. We mention these conditions because neither we nor our manufacturing partners can be responsible for the types or degrees of variations which may characterize your cabinetry.

Stain and Paint - Sample Color Matching

Due to methods involved in the color match process, touch up stain may not be possible to generate.
